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It seems like we were just celebrating the holidays and now here we are with Spring Break upon us. Where does the time go? With the weather being all over the place like it has been recently, it certainly hasn't been helpful in reminding us what time of year or season it is! No matter the time of year, our campus is always buzzing with activity. The kids are busy with school, extra-curricular activities and therapy. The staff members are working hard to support them and to make sure they always have what they need. Last, and certainly not least, Club members are working tirelessly in the warehouse, attending meetings and planning fun events for the cottages. Shining Star Gala was a wonderful event that demonstrated the effort, collaboration and dedication that it takes from you to benefit The Home.

Another type of buzzing on campus that you may have noticed in the recent weeks is from emergency vehicles pulling into the parking lot. You might see a police car, ambulance or fire truck on our campus from time to time, and I know this must be concerning to see. I want to assure you that we are constantly working to keep the kids safe and meet their significant needs. I thought it might be helpful for you to have some context around the reasons our staff members have to call for emergency support.

When one of our girls runs away or doesn't come home from school or work on time, we are required by Residential Child Care Licensing to make a report to police within a certain timeframe. Most of the time, our kids return and we cancel the report. Both of these reports require the police to come to our campus to take the information in person. Another reason we would call for support is if one of our children has a medical issue like an allergic reaction or serious asthma attack. Our staff members would first consult with our nurse and if she deems it necessary for immediate attention, we call for paramedics. There are also times when more than one child exhibits aggressive behavior at once. As you can imagine, this can quickly get out of control and we work to contain these situations as quickly as possible. If residents try to fight one another or if we have multiple situations requiring several staff to assist, we call for the police to help us get things settled. As you know, some of our kids have a tendency to turn their sadness inward, which can result in self-harming or suicidal thoughts. If a particular child is assessed by one of our licensed therapists as an imminent danger to herself, we would call for a Mental Health Officer within the police department to assist in getting this child into a psychiatric hospital so she can receive psychiatric assistance to stabilize and return to us.

There also might be times when you arrive to campus and the front gate is closed. This is typically due to a child attempting to run away. We have the interior perimeter gate that prevents children from leaving because it requires a key to open. However, that perimeter gate only surrounds the 3 Residential Treatment Center Cottages. If the child is not within that perimeter gate for any given reason, she could run out of the main gate entrance. Staff members sometimes close that gate as a precaution until the situation is managed. If you ever pull up to campus and that gate is closed, you are welcome to call for someone to come open it. If it is during business hours (Monday-Friday, 9-5) you can call the main number (512-836-2150). If it is after hours or on the weekend, you can call the campus coordinator cell phone (512-466-5753). This information is posted on a sign on the gate as well.

In other news, you will be pleased to know that we have hired a new development director! Her name is Trenton Foster and she is coming to us from Any Baby Can. I think she will be a great fit for our team and will help us reach our goals of growing our fundraising revenue in the coming years. Her start date will be March 20, and she's very excited to get going!

I appreciate all you do to support the important work that is done each and every day at The Settlement Home. It is a privilege to serve the deserving and resilient young people that we do. Small miracles happen here every day and we have The Settlement Club to thank for making it all possible.

Endowment Committee News

The quarterly meeting of The Settlement Club Endowment Committee was held on January 20, 2017. Brian Maguire of Frost Bank reported on the 2016 yearend performance of The Endowment Fund. As of December 31, 2016, the value of the Endowment Fund was \$7,389,221. This was a total portfolio return of 5.26% for the entire year 2016. Asset allocation was stocks (63%), bonds (33%) and cash (4%).

Membership in the Mildred Gregg Wendlandt Legacy Society has grown to 72 members! Our three newest members were recognized at the Club New Member Luncheon in January. The next quarterly meeting will be held on April 19, 2017.
