

Who We Serve

Through summer programming, volunteers provided 120 workshops for residents, and 25 mentors gave 488 hours of support.

Continuum of Care

Located in Austin on a 10-acre campus, The Settlement Home for Children is a licensed nonprofit that helps children in foster care access the support they need to restore and preserve a permanent sense of well-being.

At The Home, we offer a long-term therapeutic living situation by providing a continuum of care: as residents complete their treatment goals, they have the opportunity to move to another program within our organization. This unique environment gives our residents stability because they do not have to move to another agency or organization if their treatment goals change. At each step along the continuum, our staff evaluates and ensures the safety and therapeutic needs of each resident in our care.

OUR PROGRAMS

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT CENTER

Our Residential Treatment Center (RTC) provides 27 beds for girls and young women ages 11–21 in a highly structured environment with 24-hour therapeutic support. While many children in foster care are in the state's custody for basic needs, all residents at The Settlement Home for Children come to us with urgent, critical needs. Our RTC is a safe and nurturing environment that allows our residents to begin trusting the healing process.

GROUP HOME PROGRAM

Our Group Home Program (GHP) provides 23 beds for girls and young women ages 11–21 in a home-like setting with 24-hour therapeutic support. The goal of the GHP is to create a family-like environment while giving our residents the opportunity to practice independent living skills that will help them prepare for adulthood. Residents grocery shop together, cook at home and enjoy independent recreation time.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM

Our Transitional Living Program provides 11 efficiency apartments for young women 18 and older who are not quite prepared to live on their own and therefore choose to remain in the custody of Child Protective Services. Residents live in apartments on our campus and receive case management and therapy. These young women continue to build life skills like financial literacy and job preparedness.

FOSTER & ADOPTION PROGRAM

Our Foster & Adoption Program (FAP) works with Child Protective Services to provide either a temporary or permanent home for boys and girls of all ages who can no longer remain in their current living situation. Transitioning into a foster or adoptive family can be a challenging time for children. To best support families during this transition period, our FAP trains foster and adoptive families in traumainformed care and supports them through the foster and adoption process.

UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS CHARTER SCHOOL

Our on-campus University of Texas Charter School serves students from sixth through 12th grades, within a supportive learning environment. To support our students as they work towards their academic goals, The Home provides individualized student graduation plans, regular one-on-one support, credit recovery and weekly tutoring.
